1. Section I: Introduction

1.1 About DEI

DEI was accorded the status of 'Deemed to be University' by the Government of India, under Section 3 of the UGC Act of 1956, on May 16, 1981 and approve of 12B status on March 28, 2018. DEI was adjudged 5th in 'SWACHHTA' Ranking - 2017. DEI has also been recognized for its energy conservation initiatives by MNRE, Government of India. The DEI Education Policy was formulated in 1975 with a focus on the development of all three dimensions of a human being, i.e., physical, mental and spiritual, which can be achieved by undertaking intellectual, physical and social activities. Objective

The objective of this Notice for Tenders is to select a vendor for supplying and installing the equipment with the required specifications at DEI.

2. Section II: Instructions to Venders

General Instructions

2.1 Tender Validity

- 2.1.1 Tenders submitted by Venders shall remain valid for acceptance for ninety (90) calendar days from the next day of the last date mentioned in the event date. A tender valid for a shorter period may be rejected by the Purchaser as being non-responsive.
- 2.1.2 In exceptional circumstances, the Purchaser may solicit the Venders' consent to an extension of the Tender validity period. The request and responses thereto shall be made in writing. If a Vender accepts to prolong the period of validity, the Bid Security shall also be suitably extended. A Bidder may refuse such request which will not lead to forfeiting its Bid Security. A Bidder granting the request will neither be required nor permitted to modify its Bid.

2.2 Cost of Bidding

- 2.2.1 The Bidder/Vender shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of the Tender and any subsequent events/activities of Bidder related to this document.
- 2.2.2 The Purchaser will in no case be responsible or liable for these costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

2.3 Language of Tender

The Tender as well as all correspondence and documents relating to it exchanged by the Bidder and the Purchaser, shall be written in English. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Tender may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in English, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Tender, such translation shall govern.

2.4 Bidder to obtain his own information

- 2.4.1 The Bidder shall for all purposes deemed to have independently obtained all necessary information for the purpose of preparing his Tender. The correctness of the details given in the Tender Document is for guideline information only, to help the Bidder prepare his Tender. The cost of visiting the sites shall be borne by the Bidder. Non-familiarity with the site conditions will not be considered a reason either for extra claims or for not providing services in strict conformity with scope and special conditions of the contract.

2.5 Clarification on Tender Document

- 2.5.1 Bidders requiring any clarification on the Tender Document may notify the Purchaser (*at its Postal/e-mail address given in Event Date*) in writing not later than one day before the last date of the Tender submission.
- Similarly, if a Bidder feels that any important provision in the documents is unacceptable; such an issue should be raised at this stage. The Purchaser will respond during pre-bid conference (*Date, time and venue will be as mentioned in Event Date*) to any request for clarification or modification of the Tender Document. Authorized Representative of the Bidders will be allowed to attend the pre-bid conference. Personal queries from individuals shall not be entertained.
- 2.5.2 If deemed fit, written copies of the Purchaser's response (*including explanation of queries without identifying its source*) will be sent after pre-bid conference to all the Bidders in the form of addendum/corrigendum.

2.6 Amendment of Bidding Document

- 2.6.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of the Tender, Purchaser may modify the Tender Document by issue of an Addendum/Corrigendum.
- 2.6.2 In addition, Purchaser may issue addendum/corrigendum to the Tender Document to make/reflect amendment(s) in Terms & Conditions or Scope of Work specified in this Tender Document.
- 2.6.3 Any such Addendum/Corrigendum will be made available at the DEI, AGRA website. No separate other communication in this regard shall be made with any Bidder. It will be the responsibility of the Bidder to regularly visit the website to keep updated on such changes.
- 2.6.4 No clarification obtained through verbal communication by the Bidders from any officer, agent or employee of the Purchaser or any staff of the Program Management Consultant will be deemed as Addendum/Corrigendum to the Tender document.
- 2.6.5 The Purchaser, at its discretion for any reason whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a bidder may add, modify or remove any element of the services of goods.
- 2.6.6 In order to provide Bidders/Venders reasonable time to take the addendum/corrigendum into account in preparing their Tenders, the Purchaser may, at its own discretion, extend the last date of Bid submission. In such an event, Bidders shall not be entitled to any compensation, in any form whatsoever.

2.7 General Instruction for Bid Preparation

- 2.7.1 The Bidders are advised to submit their Tenders complete in all respect. The Bidder shall submit a comprehensive list of attached forms/declarations/certificates etc. in response to Tender Document.
- 2.7.2 The Bidders in their own interest are advised to be very careful while writing quantity and rates in Tender. The quantity and rates should be written very neatly, preferably typed, and there should be no overwriting or corrections. In case there are some corrections or overwriting, the same should be signed by the Authorized Signatory. The quoted prices shall be inclusive of statutory taxes, duties and other levies.
- 2.7.4 The Scope of Work specified in this Tender Document shall be executed strictly in accordance with the conditions specified in the General Conditions of Contract and other conditions specified in various sections of this Tender Document. If any of the aforesaid conditions is not clear to a Bidder, clarification may be sought from the Purchaser as per the provisions of clause 2.10 (*Clarification on Tender Document*).
- 2.7.5 The Bidders must accept all the conditions specified in the Tender Document to facilitate early finalization of Bids. Separate set of commercial conditions (*such as Bidder's standard printed conditions*) enclosed with the offer and any reference thereto may prevent the Bid from being considered by the Purchaser.

2.8 Preparation of Tender

- 2.8.1 If Bidder submits or participates in more than one Tender, such Tenders shall be disqualified.
- 2.8.2 The Tender as well as all related correspondence exchanged by the Bidders and the Employer shall be written in English language, unless specified otherwise.
- 2.8.3 In preparing their Tender, Bidders are expected to examine in detail the documents comprising the Tender. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested may result in rejection of the Tender.
- 2.8.4 The Tender shall include Technical & financial information separately.

2.9 Corrupt Practice

- 2.9.1 The Purchaser requires bidders, SI, and contractors to observe the highest standard of ethics during the execution of such contracts.
The following definitions apply:
- 2.9.1.1 Corrupt practice means the offering, giving receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of any party in the procurement process or the execution of a contract.
- 2.9.1.2 Fraudulent practice means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract.
- 2.9.1.3 Collusive practices mean a scheme or arrangement between two or more bidders, with or without the knowledge of the DEI, designed to influence the action of any party in a procurement process or the execution of a contract.
- 2.9.1.4 Coercive practices mean harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons, or their property to influence their participation in a procurement process, or affect the execution of a contract.
- 2.9.2 The Purchaser will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract.
- 2.9.3 The Purchaser will sanction a party or its successor, including declaring ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, to participate in projects if it at any time determines that the Bidder has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for, or in executing, a DEI contract.
- 2.9.4 Furthermore, Bidders shall be aware of the provision stated in clause 3.15 (*Termination of Contract*) of the General Conditions of Contract.

2.10 Conflict of Interest

- 2.10.1 Bidder shall hold DEI's interest paramount, without any consideration for future work and strictly avoid conflict with other assignment or their own corporate interest.
- 2.10.2 Bidder should not be engaged in any such business (*excluding any work assigned to them by DEI*) which has conflict of interest with the project for which the Tenders are being submitted.
- 2.10.3 DEI considers a conflict of interest to be a situation in which a party has interests that could improperly influence that party's performance of official duties or responsibilities, contractual obligations, or compliance with applicable laws and regulations, and that such conflict of interest may contribute to or constitute a prohibited corrupt practice. A Bidder may be considered to be in a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this bidding process if, including but not limited to:
Receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from any of them; or have common controlling shareholders, or have the same legal representative for purposes of this Tender, or have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the Tender of another Bidder, or Influence the decisions of the DEI regarding this bidding process.
- 2.10.4 Bidders have an obligation to disclose any situation of actual or potential conflict that impacts their capacity to serve the best interest of Purchaser, or that may reasonably be perceived as having this effect. If the Bidder fails to disclose said situations and if the Purchaser comes to know about any such situation at any time, it may lead to the disqualification of the Bidder during bidding process or the termination of its Contract during execution of assignment.

2.11 Right of Purchaser to Accept or Reject Tenders

- 2.11.1 The Purchaser reserves the right to accept or reject any Tender, and to annul the bidding process and reject all Tenders at any time prior to award of Contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected Bidder or Bidders or any obligation to inform the affected Bidder or Bidders of the grounds for the Purchaser's action.
- 2.11.2 The right to accept the Tenders in response to this Tender Document will rest with the Purchaser. The Purchaser further does not bind himself to accept and reserves the authority to reject any or all the Tenders received without assigning any reason whatsoever.

2.12 Tender Opening

- 2.12.1 The Tenders will be opened as per dates given in the portal.
- 2.12.2 The submitted Tenders must be readable through open standards interfaces. Unreadable and or partially submitted Tender files will be considered incomplete and rejected for further Tender evaluation.

2.13 Tender Evaluation

- 2.13.1 The evaluation process of the Tender document, proposed to be adopted by the Purchaser is indicated under this clause.
- 2.13.2 Evaluation Qualification Tender
- a) First the Pre-Qualification Proposal will be evaluated and only those bidders who qualify the requirements will be eligible for next set of evaluations. Technical Proposal of Venders / Bidders, who do not meet the Pre-Qualification criteria, will not be opened.
 - b) Documents and required forms submitted by the bidders as part of the Pre-Qualification criteria will be opened and evaluated for compliance in this stage of evaluation.
 - c) Bidders financial criteria: Bidders will have to submit Balance sheet and income tax returns.

2.13.3 Evaluation of Technical Tender

Kindly add support documents like design sheets, data sheets, certificates whatever necessary to support your technical Tender

- a) DEI will review the documents of the bidder. Evaluation shall be on the basis of technical specifications proposed subject to compliance with requirements. Tenders that are not substantially responsive are liable to be disqualified at DEI discretion.
- b) In order to assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Tenders, the Purchaser may at its discretion ask the Bidder for a clarification regarding its Tender. The clarification shall be given in writing immediately, but no change in the price shall be sought, offered or permitted. Bidder should fill and upload following required documents, which has to be used in Technical Evaluation.

8. Bidders should be OEM/Authorized partner/Authorized dealer of OEM.
9. Bidders should quote rates as per details/specifications mentioned in notice inviting Tender. The Institute reserves the right to place order for each job to single/separate vendor(s) if necessary.
10. Bidders should quote rates on FOR/Free Delivery/CIF at the sites specified in the Notice inviting Tender, inclusive of all charges else, should mention estimated cost of packing, forwarding, insurance and freight by Rail/Road/Post etc. as the case may be.

21. Delivery period of the equipment should be within three months for user-customized solution, after the issuance of purchase order.

22. The Bidder shall be required to submit the amount of **Earnest Money Deposit(EMD)** by way of demand drafts/banker's cheque/FDRs as mentioned in the Notice Inviting Tender which is refundable and a non-refundable **Tender Fee** for an amount of **Rs 200/-** (Rupees two hundred only) by way of demand drafts/banker's cheque. The demand drafts (validity 45 days beyond final bid) for earnest money deposit & tender fee must be enclosed in the envelope containing the Technical bid.
- a.) The firm(s) that are registered with the National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) / or Small-Scale Industries (SSI) are exempted from furnishing the EMD Self-attested photocopy of the valid registration certificate must be enclosed with their bid.

The Arbitration shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and the venue of arbitration shall be at Agra only. The resolution of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding on both the parties.
24. Jurisdiction: The courts at Agra alone will have the jurisdiction to try any matter, dispute or reference between parties arising out of this tender /contract. It is specifically agreed that no court outside and other than Agra court shall have jurisdiction in the matter.
25.
